

# 7th Grade Civics Project Ideas

Here are the new 7th grade civics project ideas for students:

## Government Structure and Functions

- 1 Create a poster showing how the three branches of government work together with real examples of checks and balances in action.
- 2 Design a flowchart that shows how a bill becomes a law, using a recent law passed in your state as an example.
- 3 Build a simple model of your state legislature using cardboard, showing where different officials sit and what they do.
- 4 Make a comparison chart showing the differences between local, state, and national government responsibilities.
- 5 Create a comic strip explaining how the President's Cabinet works and what each department does for citizens.
- 6 Design an infographic showing the different levels of courts in India and what types of cases each one handles.
